In 1991 the Tauranga Jazz Society invited **Derek Jacombs**, then playing guitar with country legend Ritchie Pickett, to perform a set of blues at the National Jazz Festival.

To bolster his first festival appearance Derek enlisted the help of harmonica player **Grant Bullot**. They played primarily 1930s blues and it was a huge success. So much so that, with the addition of Grant's bass-playing brother Roger, they formed an acoustic blues trio and spent the 1990s tearing around the country playing over 100 shows in one year alone.

Since then they have played in every corner of New Zealand, from Sweetwaters to the America's Cup; the Aotea Centre to the Blackball Hilton. They have released fifteen albums and a live concert film, and grown from a trad blues 3-piece to a multi-intrumental 5-piece carving out a specific "Kiwiana Blues" niche in New Zealand music.

This year Kokomo return to the National Jazz Festival for their 35th anniversary in a very special collaboration with members of the **Tauranga Big Band** and with surprise special guests throughout the evening. This will be Kokomo like you've never seen them before – let the fun begin!

Waypeople

A sonic and visual journey through the Tao Te Ching

Waypeople is a sonic and visual journey through ancient philosophical poetry that is at once solidly pragmatic and profoundly mystical. With lyrics drawn from author Ursula Le Guin's poetic English language version of the Tao te Ching, eight artists explore traditional and contemporary music forms, composition, improvisation, shadow, light & ink as they guide you through ten movements, illustrating the themes of the unseen, unheard, unnamable Tao, "wu-wei" (not-doing) and true Power.

Featuring music by **Jake Baxendale**, visual art from **Nikita** 雅涵 **Tu-Bryant**, and a musical ensemble of **Chelsea Prastiti** (voice), **Jessie Ling** (guzheng), **Callum Passells** (saxophones), **Daniel Hayles** (piano), **Johnny Lawrence** (bass) and **Cory Champion** (drums).

Nick Granville's Funk and Drum Extravaganza

This special double-feature show unfolds in two exciting halves.

First up: an organ-driven trio offering a fresh, soulful take on modern jazz. Featuring session guitarist **Nick Granville** (bandleader), Sydney-based organist **Mike Crawford**, and the dynamic drumming of Wellington's **Mark Lockett**, the trio blends bluesy grooves, rich Hammond textures, and improvisation-fuelled energy. The result is a warm, swinging sound that's both classic and contemporary—perfect for fans of vibrant, feel-good jazz.

Then comes the second half: Nick Granville's Double Drum Funk Band, a high-energy, groove-heavy ensemble powered by the explosive synergy of two drummers playing side-by-side: Darren Mathiassen (Shapeshifter, Hollie Smith) and Stan Bicknell (Natasha Bedingfield, Black Comet). Led by New Zealand guitarist Nick Granville, this band brings together Funk, Jazz, and Fusion with tight arrangements, a deep pocket, and plenty of improvisation. Expect everything from Stevie Wonder and Michael Jackson to Classic Rock, Jazz, and beyond—delivered with bold guitar work, big rhythms, and a live show that keeps audiences moving from the first note.

For the finale, Mark Lockett returns, joining the lineup for an explosive three-drummer climax. It's jazz... just not as you've heard it.

Cox tours with his exceptional Trio featuring NZ-born guitarist **Honey Boulton** and Parisian bassist **Alex Gilson** — a world-class powerhouse that leaves audiences spellbound. **Club Croco** explores alternative early-jazz repertoire, capturing the era's essence with charisma. flair and a fresh modern slant.

Renowned for his audience engagement and virtuosity,

"indisputably one of the great clarinetists of the world."
Now based in Sweden, he is touring the new work across
